Position Summary

The position of JUMP Math Volunteer-Tutor supports the Learning Disabilities Association of Niagara Region (LDANR)'s numeracy tutoring program for children in Grades 1-8 who are demonstrating math difficulties due to a diagnosed or potential learning disability. This one-on-one numeracy program is designed to motivate and help children gain confidence and academic success in their fundamental math skills by pairing them with a trained numeracy tutor. It is also designed to help volunteer-tutors gain knowledge and experience in working with children who experience difficulties learning essential math concepts. Therefore, the JUMP Math Volunteer-Tutor is responsible for developing and implementing an appropriate and effective individualized numeracy tutoring program to meet their child's unique needs and learning styles.

Responsibilities

The JUMP Math Volunteer-Tutors will:

- Work one-to-one with an assigned student who has an identified, suspected or diagnosed learning disability and who is behind in their numeracy skill development;
- Implement and deliver the JUMP Math pre-designed program lessons using direct and explicit instruction to meet the unique numeracy needs of their assigned student who is behind in their numeracy skill development;
- Extend lessons with engaging and hands-on numeracy activities and to provide opportunities for the student to practice and apply the skills learned in a fun learning environment;
- Emphasize the student's successes through graphing and showcasing mastered numeracy concepts;
- Assist the student in setting numeracy goals for themselves throughout the program to promote self-regulation;
- Administer an informal numeracy assessment on the first day(s) of programming as well as on the last day(s) of programming;
- Provide a positive learning environment to invoke self-motivation and confidence for the student as they develop principles of number sense and computational fluency;
- Provide regular positive feedback to the student on their progress to instill self-confidence in their academic development;
- Prepare a report at the end of the program identifying the student's progress and next steps;
- Communicate with the student's caregiver(s) after each session to keep them informed of the student's academic and socio-emotional progress;
- Assist the Program Facilitator, where needed.

Qualifications and Skills Required

Eligible candidates for the position include individuals who are 16 years of age or older prior to starting the volunteer position. Additional requirements and assets include:

- **Police Vulnerable Sectors Clearance** valid within the past year **(*required if 18+);**
- Access to a reliable device with a working microphone, web camera, and stable internet connection (*required for online programs);
- Access to a reliable ride to and from program site (*required for in-person programs);
- Previous experience working with individuals with learning disabilities and/or children (asset);
- Standard First Aid and CPR-C (asset).

Volunteers should demonstrate:

- Excellent verbal and written communication skills;
- The ability to work independently and as part of a team;
- Organizational skills, responsibility, patience and reliability;
- The ability to meet deadlines within a specified timeframe.

Benefits

Volunteers will develop skills such as:

- Increased knowledge of learning disabilities and various learning processes;
- Hands-on experience supporting students with varying needs;
- Practice important skills such as patience, communication, empathy, flexibility and adaptability;
- Experience assessing student achievement and progress;
- Experience planning lessons;
- Sense of community connectedness and self-fulfillment.

Support Provided

Mandatory training will be provided prior to programs commencing. In addition, the Program Coordinator is available on an ongoing basis to answer questions and provide assistance and support. The Program Facilitator will be on-shift at all times during the tutoring sessions to assist the volunteer-tutors as needed.

Volunteer-tutors will be provided with JUMP Math lesson plans that contain comprehensive lesson plans and student practice activities to implement in their sessions. Volunteer-tutors will also have full access to our resources for supplies, tools, games, etc. that would be useful for tutoring sessions.
